**RESOLUTION REGARDING FEDERAL INTEREST IMPACTS FROM THE  
COMPREHENSIVE PLAN FOR THE NATIONAL CAPITAL: DISTRICT ELEMENTS  
COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AMENDMENTS ACT OF 2010**

WHEREAS, pursuant to the National Capital Planning Act of 1952, as amended (40 U.S.C. § 8721), (“Planning Act”), the Council of the District of Columbia has adopted D.C. Act 18-0867, containing District Elements of the Comprehensive Plan for the National Capital, and submitted such elements to the National Capital Planning Commission (“Commission”) for review and comment with regard to the impact of such elements on the interests or functions of the federal establishment in the National Capital, and;

WHEREAS, the District of Columbia has successfully completed a comprehensive, public planning process which has resulted in a package of Comprehensive Plan amendments that serve the needs of all the District’s citizens and stakeholders and ensure that Washington, D.C. remains one of the great cities of the world.

BE IT RESOLVED that, pursuant to § 8721(c) of the Planning Act, the Commission, on January 6, 2011, finds that D.C. Act 18-0867 will not have a negative impact on the interests or functions of the federal establishment in the National Capital.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commission appreciates the cooperative relationship between the District of Columbia government and the federal government in supporting the development of the St. Elizabeths campus in a way that promotes economic development for the entire city and the Ward 8 community.
