Action: The National Capital Planning Commission (NCPC), as the lead federal agency, announces the availability of the *Environmental Assessment for the National Law Enforcement Museum*. NCPC has developed this document, in conjunction with the National Park Service, as a cooperating agency, to assist in the evaluation of options for accomplishing development of a museum and the potential environmental effects of the preferred action. This *Environmental Assessment* has been prepared in compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 and regulations of the Council of Environmental Quality and the Commission's Environmental and Historic Preservation Policies and Procedures, dated April 2, 2004. The document also includes information important to the consultation process under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act.

Proposed Alternative: The proposed alternative is implementation of an essentially underground museum with two above-grade entrance pavilions, a public plaza, landscape treatment, and pedestrian and vehicular circulation. It also includes recommendations for lighting, and preservation of both architectural and open space features.
