Delegated Action of the Executive Director

October 31, 2003

Pursuant to delegations of authority adopted by the Commission on October 3, 1996, I comment favorably on the preliminary and final site and building plans for a Security Forces Squadron Operations Facility, Bolling Air Force Base, Washington, DC, as shown on NCPC Map File No. 84.22(38.00) 41253.

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The Department of the (Navy) has submitted preliminary and final site and building plans for the construction of a Security Forces Squadron Operations Facility at Bolling Air Force Base (BAFB). The proposed facility is bounded on the north by Castle Avenue, on the south by Brookley Avenue, on the east by an existing parking lot, and on the west by Hangar No. 1. The proposal is being initiated to consolidate the functions of the security forces at BAFB, provide a secure center of operations, and improve the coordination and operational efficiency. The 4,300-square-foot building would provide spaces for training, interviews, conferences, an armory, classrooms, investigation, and administrative activities. The one-story structure would be finished with a reddish-brown brick and accented with a cast stone base, coping, and pilasters. It would be similar to nearby existing structures.

The Coordinating Committee coordinated the project at its October 15, 2003 meeting. The Navy has determined that the project qualifies as a Categorical Exclusion under its procedures to implement the National Environmental Policy Act. The Navy further advises that the proposed undertaking would not have an adverse effect on cultural resources. The District of Columbia State Historic Preservation Office concurs with this determination.
