PRELIMINARY AND FINAL SITE AND BUILDING PLANS**

Delegated Action of the Executive Director

December 30, 2003

Pursuant to delegations of authority adopted by the Commission on October 3, 1996, I approve the preliminary and final site and building plans for an addition to the Family Support Center, Andrews Air Force Base, Camp Springs, Prince George's County, Maryland, as shown on NCPC Map File No. 3207(38.00)41281.

The Department of the Navy (Navy) has submitted preliminary and final site and building plans for an addition to the Family Support Center at Andrews Air Force Base (AAFB) in Camp Springs, Prince George's County, Maryland. The existing Family Support Center is located in the northwest quadrant of AAFB off of Menoher Drive. The proposed 5,406-square-foot addition would be attached to the northwest end of the existing building. The Navy advises that at the time the existing building was constructed, it was anticipated that it would be expanded to include the proposed addition. The addition would be a one-story, triangular structure and would have the same architectural vocabulary as the existing. It would be primarily comprised of a reddish-brown brick with a brown standing seam metal roof. The addition would provide offices, administrative spaces; group and staff support spaces, reception, and public areas. Access to all areas would be organized from a core of public waiting and lobby functions located adjacent to the existing entry. No new employment or parking is associated with the proposal. The projected cost of the project is \$1,400,000 and occupancy is anticipated in the summer of 2005. The Navy has determined that the project qualifies as a Categorical Exclusion under its procedures to implement the National Environmental Policy Act. The Navy has not determined any properties at Andrews Air Force Base to be eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places and therefore no further review under Section 106 is required.
