NEW GUARD BOOTH
14th and C Streets, SW
Washington, DC**

Delegated Action of the Executive Director

November 26, 2004

Pursuant to delegations of authority adopted by the Commission on October 3, 1996, I approve the preliminary and final site and building plans for a new guard booth at the Bureau of Engraving and Printing's Main Building, 14th and C Streets, SW, as shown on NCPC Map File No. 1.74(38.00)41470.

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The Department of Treasury has submitted a proposal for replacing an existing guard booth located on the southeast corner of the BE&P main building. The new guard booth would essentially be located below the grade of 14th Street at the lower portion of the driveway entrance. The booth would be similar in design and color to other booths located around the BE&P building. The booth would accommodate two officers and include controls to operate the existing vehicle gates and barriers. The exterior facades would be metal and painted to match the existing limestone on the main building. The roof would be a standing seam metal roof that would match the main building's roof.

The Coordinating Committee coordinated the project at its November 10, 2004 meeting. The Department proposal as submitted conforms to the Commission's Categorical Exclusion requirements at Section 8 of the Commission's Environmental Procedures. It was also determined that the proposed undertaking would not have an adverse effect upon the Bureau of Engraving and Printing building. The District of Columbia State Historic Preservation Officer has concurred with this determination.
