Delegated Action of the Executive Director

July 29, 2004

Pursuant to delegations of authority adopted by the Commission on October 3, 1996, I approve the preliminary and final site and building plans to construct a new Building 211 Kitchen Addition at the Washington Navy Yard, as depicted on NCPC Map File No. 41.11(38.00)-41400.

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The Department of the Navy has submitted preliminary and final site and building plans for a 1600-square-foot kitchen addition for Building 211 at the Navy Yard.

The final plans include the building layout and design of the permanent addition. The building addition matches both exterior finishes and architectural design of the existing structure. This addition replaces the temporary kitchen housed in a modular structure at the building's northwest area.

The project, which involves less than 50,000 square feet of built floor area, is consistent with the master plan approved by the Commission and would have no adverse impact on land uses or environmental resources of the general site. In conformance with its NEPA compliance procedures, the NCPC staff has determined that the submitted project is a Categorical Exclusion action as defined under Section 8 of the Commission's Environmental Procedures. Building 211 is not eligible for the National Register of Historic Places nor is it within the listed Historic District of the Navy Yard. The Section 106 concurrence from the DC SHPO was completed on July 9, 2004.

The Coordinating Committee reviewed the proposal on July 14, 2004, with all participating agencies agreeing to coordinate this proposal.
