14th and C Streets, SW
Washington, D.C.**

Delegated Action of the Executive Director

April 28, 2005

Pursuant to delegations of authority adopted by the Commission on October 3, 1996, I approve the preliminary and final site and building plans for a new police booth at the Bureau of Engraving and Printing's Main Building, 14th and C Streets, SW, as shown on NCPC Map File No. 1.74(38.40)41582.

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The Department of Treasury has submitted a proposal for replacing an existing guard booth located at the northeast corner of the Bureau of Engraving and Printing's (BE&P) main building. The booth would provide security at this existing entrance for vehicles and employees. The new guard booth would be incorporated into the adjacent existing planter. It would be similar in design and color of another guard booth at this facility approved by delegated action of the Executive Director in November, 2004. The lower portion of the exterior façade would be faced with limestone to match the adjacent limestone planter, and the upper portion would be painted metal to match the limestone of the building and planter wall. The roof would be a standing-seam metal roof that matches other booths around the building.

The project was coordinated by all agencies attending the April 13, 2005 Coordinating Committee meeting. The Department of the Treasury has determined that the proposed project qualifies as a Categorical Exclusion under its environmental procedures to implement the National Environmental Policy Act. It also determined that the proposed undertaking would not have an adverse effect upon the BE&P building. The District of Columbia State Historic Preservation Officer has concurred with this determination.
