Delegated Action of the Executive Director

October 26, 2006

Pursuant to delegations of authority adopted by the Commission on October 3, 1996, I approve preliminary and final site and building plans for an addition to the Drill Facility (Building #PS6) to provide bathrooms and locker rooms at the U.S. Coast Guard Telecommunications and Information Systems Command (TISCOM) at 7323 Telegraph Road, Alexandria, Virginia, as shown on NCPC Map File No. 2204.10(38.00)42127.

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The United States Coast Guard (USCG) has submitted preliminary and final site and building plans for a 440-square foot addition to a 12,000-square foot building located at the U.S. Coast Guard Telecommunications and Information Systems Command (TISCOM) in Alexandria, Virginia. The addition will be a one-story modular building to house locker rooms and bathrooms for the Drill Facility, which is a pre-engineered metal building. The addition, also of pre-engineered metal, will be built on a concrete slab on the one-story north façade of the building. No parking, driveways, or other site improvements are included with the project, and no impacts to the site are anticipated other than in the area of the addition.

The Coast Guard base covers 200 acres, of which 32 acres are suitable for buildings and site improvements. USCG has submitted a Categorical Exclusion Determination to address the requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). USCG has concluded its consultation with the Virginia State Historic Preservation Office, determining that the project will have no effect on historic resources. NCPC staff concurs with the determination.
