

## Report of the Executive Director

During the past month, the Executive Director took the following action under the Commission's delegation authority. Unless otherwise noted, all projects are in Washington, DC.

1. Preliminary and final building plans for replacement of storefronts and doors at the U.S. Office of Personnel Management, Theodore Roosevelt Building, 1900 E Street, NW. (8057)

During the past month, NCPC staff determined that the following projects are exempt from Commission review, based on certain criteria. Unless otherwise noted, all projects are in Washington, DC.

### Planning Updates

#### **Comprehensive Plan for the National Capital: Transportation and Workplace Elements**

NCPC staff continues its policy development for the Comprehensive Plan's Transportation and Workplace Elements. On February 26, 2019 they met with General Services Administration representatives **Rodney Moulden** and **Mark Poling** to discuss the element updates. It is anticipated that these elements will be submitted to the Commission in the third quarter of FY 2019.

#### **Monumental Core Lighting Policy and Framework**

The Monumental Core Streetscape Project is a collaboration between NCPC and the National Mall Interagency Working Group to update the streetscape manual that guides agencies when designing and constructing roadway and streetscape improvements around the National Mall. At its April meeting the Commission will hear an information presentation on the lighting framework that provides general principles for lighting in the monumental core. 
#### **Federal Capital Improvement Program**

Policy & Research Division Director **Michael Sherman** and Urban Planner **Angela Dupont** met with **Lloyd Fulk** and **Larry Travis** from the Smithsonian's Office of Planning, Design and Construction to discuss the fundamentals of the Federal Capital Improvement Program (FCIP). Topics discussed were the FCIP's goals and objectives, overall process, as well as the FCIP schedule and deliverables for submitting Smithsonian projects to NCPC. The FCIP will be brought to the Commission in July.

- Prince William County’s Proposed FY 2020 Budget, including the Proposed FY 2020-2025 CIP
- Montgomery County Recommended FY20 Capital Budget and Amendments to the FY 2019–2024 CIP



**Interagency Security Council**



He discussed his pioneering integrated security model, which is an industry-leading method of bringing all facets of organizational security together, including physical security, cybersecurity, surveillance, the human firewall, and governance.
