# **Planning Updates**



# Pennsylvania Avenue Initiative

NCPC and project partners shortlisted three consultant teams and are entering the next phase of evaluation for the Pennsylvania Avenue Initiative's Implementation Program component. Submissions for the Request for Proposals 2, the Public Space Master Plan and Concept Design, were due on March 1, 2024. In February, NCPC published a blog to help the public understand the concurrent planning efforts by different agencies that share similar goals to enliven downtown's economy and enhance its public spaces. Some of these plans include NCPC's Pennsylvania Avenue Initiative, Mayor Bowser's DC Comeback Plan, Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development's Gallery Place/Chinatown Task Force, and the Downtown Business Improvement District's Downtown Action Plan. ### **Monumental Core Framework Plan**

In February, Physical Planning Division staff concluded coordination with the Interagency Working Group members on the development of the *Small-Scale Elements Streetscape Guidelines*, as well as the Federal LED Streetlighting Performance Criteria. On March 21, 2024, the U.S. Commission of Fine Arts will receive an information presentation on the guidelines, which will also be submitted for NCPC Commission review and acceptance in April.

Fourth-year architecture students presented their visions for improving the public realm along 7th Street, NW between F and H Streets, NW.



## NCPC's 2024 Centennial

More than 200 people attended the kickoff event, *One Night, 100 Years*, a virtual exploration of the Online Planning Library and select entries that shaped the region's development. Staff are continuing to refine the upcoming physical and digital exhibits on the agency's milestone. They are also conducting interviews for the oral history archive that captures reflections from former Commissioners and staff who influenced the agency's work.
