STEP 1

PROJECT INITIATION

- Develop purpose & need
- Public scoping

STEP 2

DATA COLLECTION

- Analysis of existing conditions
- Identify needed studies
- Identify historic properties

WE ARE HERE

STEP 3

ALTERNATIVES/ANALYSIS

- Develop and analyze a range of alternatives
- Assess effects

STEP 4

PRODUCE DOCUMENT

- Release EA to public, including proposed historic preservation and environmental mitigation measures
- 30-day public comment period

STEP 5

DECISION

- Review all public comments received on the EA and respond to comments
- Prepare Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI), as appropriate
































PERSPECTIVE FROM 2IST STREET AND C STREET LOOKING EAST 15" DEEP SPACED 5'-8" O.C.











PERSPECTIVE OF ECCLES ENTRANCE ON 20TH STREET 15" DEEP SPACED 5'-8" O.C.


PERSPECTIVE FROM C STREET AND VIRGINIA AVENUE MASS TIMBER STRUCTURE









POTENTIAL ADVERSE EFFECTS



An adverse effect is found when an undertaking may directly or indirectly alter any of the characteristics of a historic property that qualify it for inclusion in the National Register in a manner that would diminish the integrity of the property's location, design, setting, materials, workmanship, feeling, or association.

- 1. Physical destruction or damage;
- 2. Alterations that are inconsistent with the Secretary's Standards;
- 3. Relocation of a property;
- 4. Change of use or physical features of a property's setting;
- 5. Visual, atmospheric, or audible intrusions;
- 6. Neglect resulting in deterioration; or
- 7. Transfer, lease, or sale of a property out of Federal ownership or control without adequate protections.


ECCLES BUILDING - EXTERIOR



ECCLES BUILDING EAST SITE WALL

- **Infill:** Alteration to the form and massing of the building through the infill additions.
- Site Walls: Lowing and widening of the east site walls to accommodate a new entrance.
- Courtyards: Modifications to the east courtyard to accommodate the new entrance, enclosure of east and west courtyards.

ECCLES BUILDING CONSTITUTION AVENUE LOBBY

- Lobby: Modifications to the Constitution Avenue lobby to address accessibility.
- Corridors: Modifications to corridors to accommodate a new office layout.
- Toilet Rooms: Removal of historic toilet rooms in the Governors' Wing.



FRB-EAST BUILDING NORTH FACADE

- Addition: Alteration to the form and massing of the building with a 5-story addition.
- Center Wing: Removal of the center wing.
- East and West Wings: Removal of the corners of the east and west wings for foundations and loading dock.
- **Terraces:** Alteration of the building terrace for garage ramps.
- Landscape: Removal and replacement of historic landscape features, introduction of new landscape features.



- Corridors: Modifications to corridors to accommodate a new office layout.


