STEP 2

DATA COLLECTION

- Analysis of existing conditions
- Identify needed studies
- Identify historic properties

ALTERNATIVES/ANALYSIS

- Develop and analyze a range of alternatives
- Assess effects

STEP 4

PRODUCE DOCUMENT

- Release EA to public, including proposed historic preservation and environmental mitigation measures
- 30-day public comment period

STEP 5

DECISION

- Review all public comments received on the EA and respond to comments
- Prepare Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI), as appropriate







PERSPECTIVE FROM C STREET AND VIRGINIA AVENUE UPDATED







FRB-EAST BUILDING CONSTITUTION AVE SECTION NORTH/SOUTH






FIRST FLOOR SW WING ECCLES PLAN






SECOND FLOOR NW WING ECCLES PLAN




SELECTIVE EARLY DEMOLITION OF INTERIOR FEATURES FRB-EAST



EXISTING CONSTRUCTION TO REMAIN EARLY DEMOLITION (NON-HISTORIC)







AREA OF POTENTIAL EFFECT



An adverse effect is found when an undertaking may directly or indirectly alter any of the characteristics of a historic property that qualify it for inclusion in the National Register in a manner that would diminish the integrity of the property's location, design, setting, materials, workmanship, feeling, or association.

- 1. Physical destruction or damage;
- 2. Alterations that are inconsistent with the Secretary's Standards;
- 3. Relocation of a property;
- 4. Change of use or physical features of a property's setting;
- 5. Visual, atmospheric, or audible intrusions;
- 6. Neglect resulting in deterioration; or
- 7. Transfer, lease, or sale of a property out of Federal ownership or control without adequate protections.



DIRECT VISUAL EFFECTS

ON OTHER HISTORIC PROPERTIES IN APE

Direct visual effects change the character of a historic property's setting or alter significant views.

No direct visual effects to historic properties located in the APE have been identified.



DIRECT PHYSICAL EFFECTS

ON OTHER HISTORIC PROPERTIES IN APE

Direct physical effects remove, damage, or alter a historic property.

No direct physical effects to other historic properties located in the APE have been identified.

The undertaking will have an adverse effect on the Eccles Building and the FRB-East Building properties.


ECCLES BUILDING - EXTERIOR



ECCLES BUILDING EAST SITE WALL

- Form and Massing: Alteration to the form and massing of the building through the infill additions and the enclosure of the courtyards.
- Landscape: Alterations to spatial organization through modifications to the courtyards; removal of circulation features to accommodate new entrance and parking garage; removal of character-defining vegetation; lowering and widening of the east site walls to accommodate a new entrance.

ECCLES BUILDING FIRST FLOOR CORRIDOR

- Corridors: Modifications to corridors to accommodate a new office layout.
- Toilet Room/Restroom: Retrofitting of toilet room and removal of restroom in the Governors Wing.


FRB-EAST BUILDING - EXTERIOR



FRB-EAST BUILDING NORTH FACADE

- Form and Massing: Alteration to the form and massing of the building with the 5-story addition.
- Center Wing: Removal of the center wing.
- East and West Wings: Removal of the corners of the east and west wings for foundations and loading dock.
- Exterior Cladding: Loss of historic cladding at locations due to the addition and slurry wall construction.
- Terraces: Alteration of the building terrace for garage ramps.
- Landscape: Alterations to historic spatial organization, removal and replacement of historic vegetation.



CONSERVATION MANAGEMENT PLAN

 A Conservation Management Plan that provides a framework for the ongoing care and management of the Eccles Building. Based on a thorough assessment of the building's significance, the plan would provide policies to assist the Board in the long-term management of this historic property.



HISTORY | EDUCATION

- An educational component that provides information on the history of the sites prior to the construction of the Eccles Building and FRB-East Building.
- An educational component that provides the history of each building, its architects and landscape architects, and its chronology of use.


