INTRODUCTION


Expanded Elephant Herd and Outdoor Habitat The National Zoo has expanded its Asian elephant herd to six females and one adult male. To increase the outdoor space available to the elephants, Elephant Yard 1 will be expanded by incorporating an adjacent vacant yard. See page 6 for a description of the work.

Elephant Enrichment/Training Area An Enrichment/Training Area is proposed to be incorporated into the expanded yard adjacent to the Visitor Path, benefiting the elephants, keepers and visitors.


This area will provide the elephants an enrichment opportunity to socialize with a keeper in a training session and allow keepers to closely monitor the health of the animals and look for any injuries.

Keepers cue the elephants to present their trunks, feet, ears, shoulders and rear ends for a close inspection. The keepers use positive reinforcement training by rewarding the elephants with their favorite treats every time the elephants do a behavior asked of them. Elephants always have a choice to participate or not, but most of them seem to enjoy the challenge of the routine.

The elephants have two Enrichment/Training Areas inside the Elephant House, but they are located in areas that are not open to the public. Providing an Enrichment/Training Area as part of the outdoor exhibit will create a unique visitor experience at the Zoo.










EXISTING SITE AND PHOTO KEY PLAN
















PROPOSED SITE PLAN

Elephant Yard 1 expansion will include the following work

- Remove existing elephant containment (steel bollards and cable) between Elephant Yard 1 and the vacant yard
- Add elephant containment (steel bollards and cable) along the perimeter of the vacant yard
- Add Elephant Enrichment/Training Area (steel and steel mesh) within the new containment barrier adjacent to the Visitor Path
- Remove and replace trees that are toxic to elephants, within reach of elephants, or are in poor health within and adjacent to the expanded elephant yard
- Provide storm water management




PROPOSED ELEPHANT TRAILS YARD 1 SITE PLAN


ELEPHANT ENRICHMENT/TRAINING AREA PRECEDENTS FROM U.S. ZOOS





The Smithsonian Institution (SI) completed the alterations to the Elephant House and the surrounding outdoor yards associated with the project titled "Asia Trail II Elephant House Renovation" at the National Zoological Park. The Elephant House is a contributing building to the National Zoological Park Historic District listed in the National Register of Historic Places. This project was subject to a Memorandum of Agreement between the SI and the DC SHPO dated May 2007 to resolve adverse effects from the renovation of and an addition to the Elephant House.

The National Zoo recently expanded the size of its Asian elephant herd, and in order to accommodate the new herd, is planning to expand the outdoor space available. There is an existing vacant yard, formerly the Hippo Yard, immediately adjacent to the Elephant House and surrounded by the existing Elephant Yard 1.

Minor changes are required to incorporate the vacant yard into Elephant Yard 1, and include the removal of the existing cable barrier fence within the exhibit area, and the installation of bollard and cable fencing along the north and east perimeter of the vacant yard. The bollard and cable fencing matches the existing animal containment fencing installed throughout the outdoor elephant yards. The new fencing within the expanded Elephant Yard 1 will include an Elephant Enrichment/Training Area integral with the containment fence, which will provide an opportunity for the public to observe special interactions with the elephants.

The existing fencing along the curbs of the visitor path around the Elephant Yard 1 will remain, with all of the proposed changes happening inboard of the existing fencing. The new fencing will not be physically attached to the Elephant House. The SI has applied the criteria of adverse effect in accordance with 36 CFR § 800.5, and proposes a finding of "no adverse effect" for the expansion of Elephant Yard 1. We hope that you agree with our determination, and please contact me if additional materials are required.




